In the past 47 years, just over 1,800 bred heifers have been sold through this sale, paying hard working youth project members over 2.3 million dollars. This project has had a HUGE impact on the youth in South Carolina, but not just dollar wise. These youth, as you will see through the pages of this catalog, have learned about responsibility, hard work, sportsmanship, and integrity. They have gained knowledge about the dairy industry, but have also gained confidence and friendships that will last a lifetime. #### South Carolina 4-H Dairy Heifer Project

Many 4-H members from around the state have, for the past 18 months, been experiencing the dairy industry by caring for, training, and showing their very own dairy heifer. Their project comes to an end with the annual SC Dairy Project Bred Heifer Sale. This project and the sale serve as a way for those youth who do not have the facilities to milk cows to experience raising a dairy animal and learning first-hand about the dairy industry.

The SC 4-H Dairy Heifer Project is unique in several ways. These animals were selected when they were approximately six months old. Heifers were then assigned to each participant by a random drawing. Each youth must sell his or her heifer at the conclusion of the project even though many of these youth and family members have become very attached to these heifers. The SC 4-H Dairy Heifer Project Advisory Committee does permit family members to purchase heifers being sold when prior permission has been asked for and granted by the project committee. For the 2021 Bred Heifer Sale, no buy-back permission has been granted.

These youth have worked hard during the past 18 months and have made every effort to learn about raising dairy heifers. This year has been a challenge with circumstances out of their control, but each youth has done their best and these sale animals are indicative of a job well done. This sale provides an opportunity for you to purchase well-grown replacement heifers for your herd while supporting this project and demonstrating your confidence in these youth.

This project would not be possible without the generous producers who place high quality calves into the project and support the sale at its culmination.

Due to the success of the 2020 online sale, this year's sale will be virtual and will be held on cowbuyer.com on Wednesday, October 27, 2021 at 7:00 p.m.

• Terms: Purchasing online constitutes a legal contract and promise for payment of purchases. All purchases must be paid within five (5) days of sale date and prior to load out or delivery of cattle purchased.

#### **Conditions of Sale**

Every animal is pledged to absolute sale if there are two or more bidders. If two or more persons claim the same bid, the sale manager shall designate the purchaser unless one of the claimants will advance, in which case the bidding shall be reopened. The sale manager reserves the right to reject any bid deemed irresponsible or too low. Should an animal be sick or unfit to sell, it will be withdrawn, and the cause announced. All animals have been inspected by a Heifer Project Committee member and a licensed veterinarian the week prior to the sale.

By-bidding is prohibited: by-bidding is defined as the bidding on animals sold at auction by any person or corporation having an interest in the animal. In the event any such person as above defined intends to bid at the sale, he may do so if notice of such intention to bid and for whom shall be announced prior to the sale of the animal. Any person who shall by-bid in violation of these conditions as above defined, shall be reported to the to the respective breed club.

Registration: All animals are entered in the herd register of the respective breed association headquarters. Seller guarantees the identity of each animal to appear on the registration certificate.

Transfer: Transferring of the animal shall be completed in the name of the buyer and recorded immediately following the close of the sale. Seller will cover the cost of the transfer.

Warranties: When an animal is warranted, the facts and particulars will be stated from the auction stand; otherwise, the animals are sold with all faults and nothing warranted except right and title to property. Care will be taken to announce known defects in the cattle and errors or changes to information printed in the catalog. Information announced from auction stand will take precedence over printed material.

Health: Health papers will be available on all animals.

Terms: Terms of the sale are cash unless other arrangements are made with the sale manager before the sale.
